CAMPUS SECURITY & CRIME AWARENESS

In compliance with the *Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act* the College provides an annual report with the following information to students, faculty, staff, College Board, and the community:

I. Procedures for Reporting Crimes and Other Emergencies

Students are encouraged to, and are responsible for, reporting actual and suspected criminal acts that they witness on the campus. This can be done by using one of the Emergency Call Boxes located throughout the campus. RED phones are also located in buildings and these can be used to contact the college switchboard (dial 0) or Security (dial 8533). Security can be reached from a non-campus phone by dialing 434-797-8533.

The institution, being a commuter school, does not maintain its own security force, but rather refers all matters relating to crime to the Danville Police Department. The Danville police conduct investigations of all criminal offenses that occur on the college campus.

II. Access to the Campus, Facilities, and Campus Security

New Horizon Security provides security services for the College. Campus Security opens and locks all college buildings in accordance with the schedule of classes and operating hours of the various administrative offices. On weekends, buildings are available for scheduled classes but locked during non-use times. Evening classes are not scheduled after 10:00 p.m., and the campus is closed from 11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Unauthorized persons on campus after hours will be viewed as trespassers. Students are made aware of these procedures by campus publications and campus information, such as signage, orientation information, flat-screen monitors, etc.

III. Campus Awareness Programs Relative to Safety and Security

The College provides information to employees and students via meetings, orientations, workshops, weekly or monthly newsletters, various handbooks (Faculty, Staff, and Students), flat-screen monitors in each building, and through the College website. Local law enforcement agencies may also provide crime prevention information from time to time as requested by the College.

IV. Vital Statistics

The College began keeping statistical information in July of 1991. Incident report logs, which are available for public inspection, are kept on file in Wyatt 103. The information in this report includes all crimes that occurred during 2015 and the two preceding years.

V. College Policy on Alcohol and Illegal Drugs

The DCC campus has been designated “Drug free” and only under certain circumstances is the consumption of alcohol permitted. The possession, sale, manufacture or distribution of any controlled substance is illegal under both state and federal laws. Such laws are strictly enforced by DCC Security and the City of Danville Police Department. Violators are subject to disciplinary action, criminal prosecution, fine and imprisonment. The following information is currently published in the *DCC Student Handbook* and the *DCC Catalog*:

The College is committed to providing a drug-free environment for its employees and students. It is a violation of college rules for students to manufacture, distribute, dispense, possess or use controlled substances while participating in college related activities, on or off campus. Students who are using or dealing in drugs are subject to disciplinary procedures. Students who are convicted of drug related offenses are required to notify the Vice President of Academic and Student Services within five days of such conviction. Students who are involved with drugs or who have drug-related problems are encouraged to contact the Student Services Department for assistance in obtaining treatment.

The College is committed to providing on-going educational information to students covering the effects and consequences of substance abuse. VI. College Policy on Sexual Violence, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence and Stalking

Danville Community College has adopted a policy on Sexual Violence, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence and Stalking to comply with Title IX of the Higher Education Amendments of 1972. This policy applies to all campus community members, including students, faculty, staff and third parties, e.g., contractors and visitors. The policy includes information on the definitions of these crimes, reporting incidents, handling reports, investigations, confidentiality, retaliation, amnesty, procedures, rights and options, interim measures, the resolution process, appeals, support services, timely warnings, and other related subjects. Determination of a violation of this policy will be based on a preponderance of the evidence.

Members of the campus community who believe they have been subjected to any of the crimes listed in this policy should immediately report the incident to the Title IX Coordinator, any College administrator, campus security, or local police. DCC’s Title IX contacts are:

All emergencies or any incident where someone is in imminent danger should be reported immediately to local police by dialing 911 or campus security at 434-797-8533.

VII. College Policy on Firearms and Other Weapons

The following information is published in the *DCC Catalog*:

Possession or carrying of any weapon by any person, except a police officer, is prohibited on college property in academic buildings, administrative office buildings, student centers, child care centers, dining facilities and places of like kind where people congregate, or while attending any sporting, entertainment or educational events. Entry upon the aforementioned college property in violation of this prohibition is expressly forbidden.

IX. Emergency Response and Communication

In the event of an emergency, information is communicated to the campus using the flat-screen monitors located in each building, the speakers located inside and outside of each building, pop-up messages on computer screens, and the DCC Alert system. Sign up for DCC Alert at <https://alert.dcc.vccs.edu> . The name of the cell phone/wireless provider must be known in order to sign up for the service.

DCC has developed an Emergency Operations Plan as part of its Continuity of Operations Plan. Within that plan are emergency response procedures for students and employees. These procedures are published as the Crisis Management Guide, which is posted in each classroom and in public offices. These procedures include information on emergency contacts, responses to accidents and medical incidents, locations of the AED and medical supplies in each building, cleanup of bodily fluids, and what to do in the case of a building evacuation, a weather-related incident, or a building lockdown. Building evacuations, lockdowns, and responses to weather-related incidents are practiced at least once each academic year and are done in cooperation with DCC CERT and Danville Emergency Services.
