I. CATALOG DESCRIPTION:Supervises on-the-job training in selected business, industrial or service firms coordinated by the college. Credit/practice ratio not to exceed 1:5 hours. May be repeated for credit. Variable hours.1-5 credits

II. RELATIONSHIP OF THE COURSE TO CURRICULUM OBJECTIVES IN WHICH IT IS TAUGHT: The Coordinated Internship is an opportunity for students to apply the skills and knowledge, learned from their program of study, to problems as assigned by their host business or industry. The Coordinated Internship is an integral and important learning experience to the development of highly functioning graduates.

III. REQUIRED BACKGROUND: Permission of the program head

IV. COURSE CONTENT:Provides students with on-the job training relating to the students program of study., which will prepare them for actual employment in the field. Training will include project work, project abstract, project or process report, keeping a daily log of activities, summary report and evaluation from internship supervisor or mentor. Student will be required to summit an assumption of risk form and an intern agreement with the the supporting company.
