TRIO EOC Project Director, Sharon Harris, joined over 25 Virginia TRIO Directors, staff, and students for the annual TRIO "Walk the Hill" Day on March 20, 2024. The state of Virginia was divided into a Western and Eastern team groups to better execute all the meetings. Participating on the western team, Harris attended scheduled meetings with both Senator Mark Warner and Tim Kaine offices along with Congressmen Ben Cline (VA-6), Morgan Griffith (VA-9), Bob Good (VA-5), Jennifer Wexton (VA-10) offices. These visits are crucial to the vitality of continued TRIO funding but are considered lobbying, thus all travel and meal expenses cannot be charged to the TRIO grants and vacation time must be taken. Sharon comments, "Once you attend Walk the Hill and see how important our advocacy is to continued TRIO funding, it become a priority. Attending WTH is my personal investment in the TRIO EOC program and firstgeneration students in Southside Virginia!"

Looking to get your teeth cleaned or examined? Look no further! DCC's Dental Hygiene Students have you covered!

Danville Community College (DCC) dental hygiene students are searching for patients. Under the supervision of registered dental hygienists, students provide free dental exams, X-rays, and cleanings for patients in the dental hygiene clinic. Patients also receive education on ways to improve and maintain good oral and overall health.

Students are currently looking for volunteers to participate and receive these complementary services. All patients are screened for health conditions before appointments are scheduled to ensure the safety of everyone involved. Completion of care usually consists of three to six appointments.

DCC is equipped with a state-of-the-art dental clinic that looks and functions much like a dental office. Located on the corner of South Main Street and Kemper Road in Foundation Hall on the DCC Campus, the dental clinic allows dental hygiene students to practice their skills in a hands-on setting.

For Law Enforcement Agencies

Law Enforcement Agencies with highway safety grants must conduct pre- and postsurveys for the CIOT mobilization. Attached are the PDF files containing the surveys for both the pre and post-mobilization assessments, along with the Final Enforcement Activity Reporting Worksheet.

- Pre-mobilization survey to be conducted from May 6 May 24, 2024
- Enforcement operations to take place from May 20 June 2, 2024
- Post-mobilization survey to be conducted from June 3 June 14, 2024
- All TREDC data and the issue of the law bound and the law a 20, 2024

All TREDS data entry is required and due by June 28, 2024.

When entering data into TREDS, put it under *Click It or Ticket 2024 May Mobilization*.
