Danville Community College (DCC) dental hygiene students are searching for patients. Under the supervision of registered dental hygienists, students provide free dental exams, X-rays, and cleanings for patients in the dental hygiene clinic. Patients also receive education on ways to improve and maintain good oral and overall health.


Students are currently looking for volunteers to participate and receive these complementary services. All patients are screened for health conditions before appointments are scheduled to ensure the safety of everyone involved. Completion of

care usually consists of three to six appointments.

DCC is equipped with a state-of-the-art dental clinic that looks and functions much like a dental office. Located on the corner of South Main Street and Kemper Road in Foundation Hall on the DCC Campus, the dental clinic allows dental hygiene students to practice their skills in a hands-on setting.

Drowsy Driving Prevention:

'Springing Forward' is fast approaching. Soon we will be losing an hour of sleep! This is a great time to remind our communities to prepare and avoid driving drowsy. Our partners at the DMV encourage everyone to prioritize rest before driving.

According to 2023 preliminary data, 23 people were killed and 1,604 were injured in 3,152 crashes involving drowsy drivers.

Remember to Keep Danville Safe! Dig With C.A.R.E.

If you hit a gas line while digging, smell a strong gas odor, or see/hear any unusual occurrences, you may be observing signs of a leak in a natural gas line.

Signs of a gas line leak include a high-pitched whistle or hissing sound, blowing dust, dead vegetation in a normally green area, continuous bubbles in an underwater area, and ground fires.

If you suspect a gas leak, report it immediately to Danville Utilities at (434) 799-5284. Keep people clear of the area and ensure there is no risk of ignition (for instance: someone smoking, using a mobile telephone, or using electrical appliance nearby).


